Clinical Signs The most common signs of LUTD include: Difficult or painful urination. Increased frequency of urination. Crying out while urinating. Blood in the urine. Inappropriate urination (that is, outside of the litter box) Frequent licking of the genital region.

Signs include: frequent trips to the litter box (pollakiuria) prolonged squatting and straining during attempts to urinate (dysuria) blood in the urine (hematuria) urinating outside of the litter box no urine voided at all at each attempt or only isolated drops produced (“spotting”)

Diagnosing and Managing Feline Lower Urinary Tract Disease

FLUTD describes a collection of common conditions that affect the bladder and/or urethra – the narrow tube that carries urine from the bladder to the outside of the body. It includes the condition commonly known as cystitis – inflammation of the bladder – and does not usually involve the kidneys. The signs shown by cats with FLUTD are often similar, regardless of the cause.

Idiopathic Feline Lower Urinary Tract Disease is a diagnosis of exclusion, which means your veterinarian must rule out other diseases (e.g., bladder stones, tumors, and infections) that cause similar symptoms.

Urinary Tract Disease in Cats: Treatment for Feline Lower ...

Seventy-five cats (87%) lived longer than 6 months; 45 (60%) of these were asymptomatic after surgery; 8 of 75 cats (10.7%) experienced severe signs of recurrent feline lower urinary tract disease. For 19 cats, data were available for more than 6 years. Among these, 13 cats were still alive at the time of this study.

Lower urinary tract diseases are a group of conditions that can affect your cat's ability to urinate or use the litter box normally. Your veterinarian might refer to this as FLUTD (Feline Lower Urinary Tract Diseases), or LUTS (Lower Urinary Tract Signs).

True urinary tract infections in cats are very rare. Instead, in cats, we see a range of conditions which can cause cystitis, referred to as feline lower urinary tract disease (FLUTD). FLUTD is any disorder affecting the bladder or urethra of cats. It is common, affecting approximately 1-3% of cats each year.
