With Maldives generating about 365,000 tons of solid waste annually, the management of solid waste is a pressing environmental issue in this popular tourist destination. Recent estimates indicate that solid waste is generated at a rate of 1.8 kg per person per day in Malé, 0.8 kg per person per day on the other inhabited islands, and 3.5 kg per person per day in resort islands.

Solid waste management now benefits 900 people on the island of Ulkulhas. Solid waste is the most visible environmental threat to the Maldives. The management of solid waste is especially challenging due to the small island sizes, small population on the islands and lack of economic activities. With a population spread across the island chain there is little scope for harnessing economies of scale due to large costs of transportation and low volumes, making the costs of service delivery high.

Solid Waste-Quantities. About 860 metric tons per day (mtpd) of solid waste is discarded in the Maldives. Tourism accounts for 21% of discards, with the balance attributed to urban areas (65%) and island communities (35%). A majority of solid waste from tourism (134 mtpd) comes from resorts. A lesser amount of waste (8 mtpd) is from safari vessels.

Greater Malé and its inhabited outer islands lack an organized and sustainable waste management system for the 774 tons per day (tpd) of mixed solid waste they generate.3Because of rapid urbanization and tourism development in the region, waste generation is expected to grow to 924 tpd by 2022 (footnote 3).

The project will establish a sustainable regional solid waste management (SWM) system for the Greater Male region and its neighboring outer islands by (i) developing treatment (proven waste-to-energy [WTE] technology), recycling, and disposal infrastructure; (ii) strengthening institutional capacities for sustainable solid waste services delivery and environmental monitoring; and (iii) improving public awareness on WTE and reduce-reuse-recycle (3R).

~~Maldives: Greater Male Waste to Energy Project~~

Thilafushi, the trash island of Maldives, collects trash from many residential islands in Kaafu Atoll and resorts across the country. Trash is sorted and materials such as plastic and metal are recycled, house-hold waste is mostly incinerated. Construction waste is dumped to the sea to extend the land area.
